

Adams County Conservaiton Board

Adams County Conservation Board is seeking bids for the following concrete projects at the Lake Icaria Beach area.

Parking wall/step with frost free footing: 240 feet x 24 inches

 Removal of existing railroad tie barrier at west side of parking area and replacement with poured in place concrete parking curb with one step along approximately 240 feet of parking lot.

Retaining wall at beach area with a 6-foot sidewalk on upper side of retaining wall: Approximately 345 feet retaining wall 4 feet tall x 8 inches thick with frost free footing. Approximately 130 feet of 6-foot-wide sidewalk.

Remove existing railroad tie retaining wall and replace with concrete.
Approximately 4-foot-tall retaining wall to be partially buried to be below frost line. Bracing as needed to hold in place. Approximately 125 feet of 6 foot wide 4-inch-thick sidewalk area above the wall.

Three 16-foot x 17-foot pads 6 inches thick under picnic shelters.

 We have 3 shelter houses west of the beach area we would like concrete pads poured under. There is some slope to these and there may need to be a small retaining wall at each of the three sites.

Install approximately 450 feet of 6in perforated tile to address drainage issues. 2 tile inlets. Please include price per foot of tile. Distance may change.

Work may begin after Labor Day weekend 2025 and shall be completed prior to Memorial Day Weekend 2026. Work will be back filled and graded ready to seed. Seeding will be determined at a later date and not figured into this bid.

These are the figures to use for bidding purposes only. Please include price per each project and price per yard of concrete as Adams County Conservation reserves the right to change quantities to match available funds.
