

**Board Minutes June 16, 2025**

The Adams County Board of Supervisors met on Monday, June 16, 2025, at 9:00 AM with the following members present: Tony Hardisty, Scott Akin, Leland Shipley, and Bobbi Maynes. Chris Standley was absent. The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Hardisty at 9:00 AM. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Akin moved, seconded by Shipley to approve the agenda and the minutes of the June 9<sup>th</sup> meeting. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.

Secondary Roads Update – There will be a pre-construction meeting with Godbersen-Smith Construction Co. for the Colony 19 bridge replacement project starting in July. Ten-Point Construction completed bridge approaches on Union 10 and other concrete patches in the county. Continue to haul rock and mow shoulders. Completed the temporary road for the Hungry Canyons project, but delivery of the pipe was delayed two weeks. Union 17 bridge on Redwood is closed, and we are in the early planning stages.

Maynes moved, seconded by Shipley to approve utility permit 25-06 Coon Valley Telco. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.

Shipley moved, seconded by Akin to approve the Interim Engineer Agreement with Nick Kauffman to provide engineering services for 180 days starting July 1, 2025. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.

Shipley moved, seconded by Akin to approve Resolution 2025-26 Signature Designation for Nick Kauffman.

Department heads reports: Conservation – Seasonal employees are getting along well. Great weather this past weekend; many were at the beach, campgrounds and on the lake. The lake is still more than two feet low. We have not had any issues with underwater reefs and fish structures. Low later areas are marked on maps, but not by buoys. There will be a wood duck program and archery this Wednesday at 6 pm. About 50 people attended the photography program. There have been six to twelve people at archery each week and about a dozen people attended the kayaking event. The Triathlon will be on August 23. The permits are ready, the diving team is scheduled, and we will work with secondary roads to sweep rocks from highway corners. We are also looking for volunteers. IT – There was discussion of AI during the IT conference. The consensus was not to have a specific AI policy but include it in an overall software policy. Currently looking at other counties’ policies. Auditor – Preparing for the end of the year.
