County Attorney Knuth will draft language for residing within Adams County in Ordinance Chapter 6, General Assistance.

Alicia Reed with Corning CHI gave an update on doctors, providers and services offered. Jerry Lager, EMS Director with Adams County Ambulance, gave an update including one ambulance was remounted. They would like to start the process for another as there is a two-year waitlist. Paramedics and hospital employees are good about filing in as needed for volunteers. They have been picking up more hospital-to-hospital transfers from other facilities.

Discussion was held regarding an updated Ambulance Management Services Agreement. Lager and Gwen Larson have been researching agreements and will provide the current agreement for comparison.

Sandra Leininger presented the Historic Preservation Commission Annual Report. Shipley moved, seconded by Maynes to approve the Historic Preservation Commission Annual report. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.

Treasurer Schafer presented tax abatement requests from the City of Corning on Parcel# 6806400 and 8777100. Akin moved, seconded by Shipley to abate the taxes on the properties. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.

Akin moved, seconded by Shipley to approve signing the underwriting engagement agreement with DA Davidson. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.

Akin moved, seconded by Shipley to approve signing the disclosure letter with DA Davidson. All supervisors voted aye. Motion carried.

Department heads reports: Veterans Affairs – Not planning on pursuing a 28E agreement with Taylor County right now. They are in the process of hiring their own director. Treasurer – Starting to receive March property tax payments. Auditor – Deputized Kandi Miller. Township clerks and trustees are starting to fill out payroll paperwork. Continue to work on the budget. Filing period for the primary election is March 2-20.
